Students Rights and Responsibilities

All students have the rights to: All students have the responsibility to:

Be educated – Learn without disruption To learn – Avoid disrupting self and others

To be listened to and speak respectfully To follow instructions and speak respectfully at all times

Feel safe and secure Avoid hurting others

Be in an environment free from bias/discrimination Respect self and others

Participate in decision making Earn trust

Be rewarded Take responsibility for their own actions and belongings

Class Teacher Rights and Responsibilities

Class teacher has the right to:

Teach without disruption

Manage and facilitate learning

Dignity and respect to be recognized

Be free from bias and discrimination

Encourage positive behavior and hard work

Class teacher has the responsibility to:

Cater for holistic development of students.

Implement classroom behavior management plan

Be polite and protect students

Show love and respect to all students

Reward positive behaviors and efforts

What students and parents can expect from class teacher?

Care and consideration

Confidentiality

Equity – treating all students fairly

Respectful

Punctuality

Be prepared for class

Display work

What class teacher and school expects from students

- To be equipped for learning (have all necessary tools)
- Be well groomed (e.g., nails short and clean, hair neatly combed)
- Use appropriate language
- Show respect at all times
- Be actively engaged in learning activities
- Complete all given assignments including homework
- To be open minded and wanting to learn
- To be honest
- Good communication skills
- Obey school and class rules
- Value each other's contribution
- Raise hands to indicate your wish to speak
- Develop an appreciation for school
- Be an ambassador for Jesus and by extension the school

What class teacher and school expects from parents

- Adhere to school/class rules
- Communicate effectively and respectfully with class teacher
- Ensure the student is equipped and ready for school.
- Notify school/class of student's absence
- Support the student with homework/other homebased learning activities
- Inform the school/class teacher of any concerns or problems that may affect the child's work or behavior.
- Always interact in a respectful manner when speaking with or about the administration, teachers and staff of the school
- Attend all class meetings and respond promptly when visit is requested
- Support the class teacher by being positive.

In the Classroom

1. Students will stand when a teacher or visitor enters the classroom and remains standing until told to sit.
2. There shall be no eating (chewing of gums etc.) or drinking in the classroom.
3. Students will not talk out of turn in class or, in any other way to cause the distraction of other students.
4. All running and playing must happen in the gym, not the class room.
5. Students will speak courteously and quietly at all times.
6. In responding to teachers, students will speak distinctly. Slangs and dialects is unacceptable.
7. There should be no sitting, or standing on tables or desk tops or on the backs of chairs.
8. Furniture must be kept in an orderly arrangement.
9. Walls and surfaces of desks and chairs are not to be defaced by marking or carving.
10. A student will leave a class only with the permission of the person who is in charge of the class e.g. using bathroom.
11. All students will complete given task within given timeframe.
12. Only indoor voice is permitted in the classroom – no screaming or shouting is allowed unless it lends itself to an activity.
13. No bullying
14. No fighting

Classroom Rules

1. Respect and listen to all teachers.
2. Remember it's good manners to greet your teacher/s and classmates when you enter class.
3. Only in-seat behavior – Seek permission to get up out of seat during class instruction.
4. Speak one at a time with permission.
5. Walk quietly in classroom.
6. Have all your pencils sharpened at home before you enter class.
7. No borrowing: bring your own.
